Take DalesBus 24 from Harrogate to Pateley Bridge



One of the delights of travelling between Harrogate and Pateley Bridge is the journey itself, with splendid views from the bus window, from the pleasant suburbs of Harrogate across and into Nidderdale. From Killinghall the bus turns westward to head through open countryside before going through Hampsthwaite, whose ancient church has connections with St Thomas a' Becket, then through lovely rolling landscape of the AONB before turning into Birstwith, with its Station Inn, a link with Nidderdale's long lost railway line. The long village of Darley then follows, a village which can be explored on foot along the fascinating Darley Heritage Trail. The bus now swoops down into the valley at Dacre and Dacre Banks, crossing the river below Summerbridge, continuing through a string of former mill villages - many associated in years gone by with the flax industry - Low Laithe, Wilsill and Glasshouses, before winding its way down to Pateley Bridge.

Pateley Bridge, the capital of Nidderdale, once a centre of textile, lead mining and quarrying industries, is today a bustling tourist destination with a choice of boutique shops (including England's oldest sweet shop), cafes, restaurants, pubs, riverside walks and a park. Not to be missed is the outstanding Nidderdale Museum in the historic workhouse in King Street, open every Sunday afternoon 1330 - 1630. Admission £2 adult, £1 concessions, accompanied children free.

Take a stroll from the 24

Alight at Darley Moke Hill to explore the Darley Heritage Trail - full details in the trail leaflet available in the village from local shops and online.

Nidderdale and the 24 provide access to many super walks, especially linear routes. Take Ordnance Survey Explorer Map 26 Nidderdale with you (available in local shops) for the following walks. Wear strong footwear, boots are recommended as paths are often muddy, always carry rainwear, a spare sweater, water and emergency food. And using the bus also means no problem about ending your walk at a friendly Nidderdale pub!

The best known longer distance walk in the area is the 53-mile Nidderdale Way, from Ripley to the head of the Dale above Middlesmoor and return as featured on Clare Balding's Ramblings on BBC Radio 4. Much of the Nidderdale Way can be accessed on the 24 for full or half day stages. Some other recommended easy walks from the 24:

- * Glasshouses to Pateley Bridge along riverside - 2 miles
- * Dacre Banks to Pateley Bridge alongside old railway line and riverside - 5 miles
- * Darley Mill to Birstwith along Nidderdale Way - 6 miles
- * Summerbridge - Brimham Rocks - Low Laithe - 6 miles
- * Pateley Bridge - Panorama Walk - Scot Gate quarries - Wath - riverside - Pateley - 6 miles
